From Indonesia to Gaza Celebrating Freedom, Sharing Hope

Project Background

On the occasion of the 81st Anniversary of the Independence of the Republic of Indonesia on 17 August 2026, this project proposes a special humanitarian, cultural, and recreational celebration for children in the Gaza Strip.

The event will bring the spirit of Indonesia's Independence Day celebrations to Gaza while creating a joyful and meaningful experience for Palestinian children.

Beyond celebrating Indonesia's national occasion, the event will highlight the strong humanitarian bond and solidarity between the Indonesian and Palestinian peoples through traditional Indonesian games, cultural activities, entertainment, gifts, meals, and direct interaction between Gaza and Indonesia.

At the heart of the project is a symbolic humanitarian initiative involving 81 orphaned children, with each child representing one year of Indonesia's 81 years of independence.

To commemorate the 81st anniversary of Indonesia's independence through a humanitarian, cultural, and recreational event in Gaza that reflects Indonesian solidarity with Palestinian children and provides them with an opportunity to experience joy, hope, and meaningful cultural interaction.

Specific Objectives

The project aims to:

-  Provide a joyful and memorable experience for 200 children in Gaza.
-  Introduce children to Indonesia and its Independence Day traditions.
-  Bring elements of Indonesia's 17 August celebrations to Gaza.
-  Provide special gifts to 81 orphaned children in symbolic recognition of Indonesia's 81st Independence Anniversary.
-  Strengthen the cultural and humanitarian connection between Indonesia and Palestine.
-  Connect Gaza and Indonesia through a live interactive broadcast.
-  Produce professional humanitarian media content documenting Indonesian solidarity with the children of Gaza.

Event Venue and Setup

The event will be held inside an indoor sports arena with tiered spectator seating. This type of venue provides a safe and organized environment for the children while creating a strong visual setting for the live broadcast, photography, and media production.

Tiered Seating

The 200 participating children will be seated across the stands.

Indonesian and Palestinian flags, along with red and white visual elements, will be distributed among the children to create a powerful visual scene.

Main Stage

A main stage facing the tiered seating will include:

- A large LED screen.
- A prominent 81 visual installation.
- Indonesian and Palestinian flags.
- INH event branding.
- Space for the host and speakers.
- Professional sound and lighting systems.

Arena Floor

The main arena floor will be dedicated to:

- Indonesian traditional games.
- Competitions.
- Entertainment performances.
- Interactive activities.
- The 81-orphan ceremony.
- Group activities and photography.

B. Official Opening

The event will begin with a short visual presentation introducing Indonesia, its Independence Day, and the meaning of the occasion.

The host will welcome the children and introduce the message behind the celebration.

The main theme will appear on the LED screen:

**From Indonesia to Gaza, Celebrating Freedom,
Sharing Hope**

Gaza × Indonesia LIVE

One of the signature components of the project will be a live connection between Gaza and Indonesia.

The LED screen inside the arena will connect the children in Gaza directly with INH representatives and/or participants in Indonesia.

The live segment may include:

- Live greetings from Gaza to Indonesia.
- A short address from an INH representative.
- Messages from Palestinian children.
- Exchange of greetings and flags.
- Independence Day congratulations from the children of Gaza.
- A symbolic activity performed simultaneously in Gaza and Indonesia.

Media Concept

One Celebration... Two Locations

Indonesia LIVE × Gaza LIVE

At a key moment during the live connection, the children will stand together, raise Indonesian and Palestinian flags, and deliver the collective message:

**“From Gaza to Indonesia...
Happy Independence Day!”**



Indonesian Independence Day Games

A key element of the event will be recreating the joyful atmosphere associated with Indonesia's Independence Day celebrations.

Traditional Indonesian games will be adapted to ensure they are safe and suitable for children and for an indoor venue.

Proposed activities include:

#	Game Name	Description	Illustrative image
1	Tug of War (Tarik Tambang)	Two teams of children pull opposite ends of a thick rope in opposing directions. The team that pulls the other across the center line wins.	 A group of children are participating in a tug-of-war competition. They are standing on a grassy field, pulling on a thick rope. 2	Sack Race (Balap Karung)	Each child stands inside a burlap sack up to the waist and hops toward the finish line. A classic, joyful game from Indonesian Independence Day celebrations. 4	Balloon Race	Children race while carrying or pushing a balloon (sometimes held between the knees or batted through the air) to the finish line without letting it drop or pop. 5	Rubber Band Collection Race	Participants collect rubber bands from a container filled with flour or sand and transfer them to their own container. #	Game Name	Description	Illustrative image
7	Bakiak Race	Several children stand together on a long pair of traditional wooden sandals (bakiak) and move in coordinated unison toward the finish line — a game built on teamwork.	
8	Pencil into Bottle	A pencil is tied to a string around the child's waist, and without using their hands, the child tries to guide it into the neck of a bottle placed behind or in front of them. Requires precision and balance, and gets lots of laughs.	

Mural Painting of President Sukarno

As part of the event's cultural and artistic program, a large wall mural depicting President Sukarno, Indonesia's founding father and first president, will be created live during the celebration. Selected children will take part in painting the mural under the guidance of a facilitating artist, transforming it into a shared, hands-on activity rather than a passive display. Beyond its artistic value, the mural stands as a lasting visual tribute to Indonesia's independence and the enduring spirit of freedom the event celebrates. Once completed, it will serve as a prominent backdrop for photography and media coverage, and may remain on-site afterward as a permanent reminder of the day's Indonesian-Palestinian solidarity.

Indonesian National Anthem Performance

A group of children will be specially trained ahead of the event to perform "Indonesia Raya," the national anthem of the Republic of Indonesia, as one of the ceremonial highlights of the celebration. Standing together with Indonesian and Palestinian flags raised, the children will deliver the anthem during a dedicated moment in the program, offering a powerful symbolic gesture of respect and solidarity with the Indonesian people on their Independence Day. This performance is intended to be one of the most emotionally resonant segments of the event, reinforcing the deep humanitarian bond between Indonesia and Gaza and creating a moving visual and audio moment for the live broadcast and media documentation.

Indonesia & Palestine Challenge

A simple and interactive cultural quiz will be presented through the main LED screen.

Questions may include:

- What are the colors of the Indonesian flag?
- When does Indonesia celebrate its Independence Day?
- What is the capital of Indonesia?
- Simple facts about Indonesia and Palestine.
- Questions about friendship and solidarity between the two peoples.
- Small prizes will be awarded to participating children and winners.





“81 Smiles of Hope” Initiative

“81 Smiles of Hope” Initiative

This initiative represents the humanitarian heart of the event.

A total of 81 orphaned children will be selected from among the participants.

Each child symbolically represents one year of Indonesia’s 81 years of independence.

During a dedicated ceremony, the 81 children will enter the arena floor while the other children welcome them with applause.

Each of the 81 children will receive a special gift package.

The LED screen will display:

81 Years of Freedom
81 Smiles of Hope

This moment will be professionally documented and featured as one of the main emotional highlights of the project’s final media production.

Children's Entertainment Program

A lively entertainment program will be organized throughout the event, including:

- Interactive performances.
- Children's entertainment characters.
- Face painting.
- Group competitions.
- Music and suitable songs.
- Interactive activities with children in the stands.
- Games, prizes, and giveaways.

Meals for Children

A total of 200 complete meals will be provided to all participating children.

Each meal may include:

Main meal

Beverage

Dessert

Where possible, the dessert or packaging may incorporate red and white elements, inspired by the colors of the Indonesian flag.

Main Visual Moment

The tiered seating will be used to create a distinctive visual scene representing the event.

Children will be strategically positioned with Indonesian and Palestinian flags, as well as red and white cards.

The number: **81**



may be formed visually across the stands using the children or colored cards.

At the same moment, Indonesian and Palestinian flags will be raised throughout the arena.

A wide official photograph will capture:

The stage + the number 81 + the tiered stands + 200 children + Indonesian flags + Palestinian flags

This photograph will serve as one of the main visual assets of the campaign.

Professional Live Broadcast

A professional live broadcast will be arranged for the event or its key segments through platforms agreed upon with INH.

Technical Requirements

The broadcast setup will include:

- Multiple professional cameras.
- Main wide-angle camera covering the stage and stands.
- Mobile camera covering activities on the arena floor.
- Professional sound system and microphones.
- LED screen.
- Live streaming equipment.
- Primary internet connection.
- Backup internet connection.
- Full high-quality recording of the live broadcast.



The event schedule will be designed so that its most important moments can be followed live by audiences in Indonesia.

Media Documentation and Production

The project will be designed not only as a field event but also as an integrated humanitarian media campaign.

Proposed Media Outputs

- Main event film.
- Short highlight video.
- Reels featuring Indonesian traditional games.
- Dedicated 81 Smiles of Hope Reel.
- Gaza × Indonesia LIVE content.
- Professional photography.
- Short interviews with children.
- Messages from Gaza's children to the Indonesian people.
- Official group photograph.
- Illustrated final project report.
- Ready-to-publish social media content.

The content can be used by INH to communicate the impact of its humanitarian engagement with children in Gaza to its supporters and audiences in Indonesia.

Visual Identity

The visual identity will primarily combine:

Red × White × Palestinian Colors



The Indonesian and Palestinian flags will be integrated throughout the venue in a balanced and respectful manner.

The number 81 will serve as the central visual element across the stage, screen content, event materials, and media campaign.

Expected Outputs

By the end of the project, the following outputs are expected:

- 200 children participate in the Independence Day celebration.
- 81 orphaned children receive special gift packages.
- 200 meals are distributed.
- Traditional Indonesian Independence Day games are implemented.
- A live interactive connection between Gaza and Indonesia is conducted.
- Children gain greater awareness of Indonesia and its culture.
- A professional media package documenting the event is produced.
- A strong humanitarian message of solidarity between the Indonesian and Palestinian peoples is communicated.
- INH receives high-quality media content highlighting the humanitarian impact of its engagement in Gaza.

Closing Message

On the 81st anniversary of Indonesia's independence, Gaza will not only celebrate an important national occasion with the Indonesian people; it will celebrate a humanitarian bond that transcends distance and borders.

Two hundred Palestinian children will gather in Gaza carrying the flags of Indonesia and Palestine, while 81 orphaned children carry 81 symbolic messages of hope to the Indonesian people.

From Gaza, their message will be:

“From Gaza to Indonesia... Happy Independence Day!”
